Evaluation Criteria

The awards will be based on an evaluation of the information provided by faculty members of their successful community engagement in teaching, research, and/or service. Please see *Community Engagement Data Definitions* (below) for a more detailed description and examples of how engagement is incorporated into these functions. Evaluations will include an assessment of the mutual benefits to the community, students and/or faculty. Research or service projects performed as part of a course or other institutional requirements are not eligible.

Community Engagement Data Definitions

Community Engagement: The collaboration between institutions of higher education and their larger communities for the mutually beneficial exchange of knowledge and resources in the context of partnership and reciprocity. It can involve partnerships and coalitions that help mobilize resources and influence systems and serve as catalysts for initiating and/or changing policies, programs, and practices.

Community-Engaged Teaching/Learning: A pedagogical approach that connects students and faculty with community-based organizations and social justice issues.
